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

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Student Feedback on Curriculum and Syllabus

Analysis and Action Taken Report

The students are the most important stakeholders of Higher Education systems. The interest and participation of students at all levels in both internal quality assurance and external quality assurance have to play a central role. A three point scale feedback form on the curriculum is developed to revise the curriculum based on the teedback. We have received a total 1229 student's online feedback on curriculum and syllabus of the various programmes designed by Velalar College of Engineering and Technology.

- 86.80% of students have the opinioned that course contents are adequate in relation to the competencies expected from the courses.
- Most of the students suggested that the curriculum and syllabus is sufficient to bridge the gap between industrial requirements and academics.
- Students reviewed that the design of the course helped them for learning content beyond the curriculum and syllabus, self learning and the syllabus was properly sequenced.
- 84.20% of the students' opinion that the text books and reference books are adequate and map onto the syllabus.
- Students suggested that the syllabus has prospects for higher education, employability, internship, training and research.
- 84.36% of the students have the opinioned that the pre-requisite courses are appropriate; the course content satisfies the needs of follow- on courses and comparatively the curriculum are enriched.
- It is observed that the practical courses develop experimental, design and analysis skills.
- Students are satisfied with the open elective courses offered in VCET.

Suggestions from students

- 1. The curriculum may have more practical approach.
- 2. Take job trends into consideration.
- 3. Include advanced technologies in courses offered.

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Action taken

- 1. Teachers are instructed to undertake more experimental teaching learning process. Many faculty members are now using ICT tools to enhance teaching learning process.
- 2. More career guidance and soft skill development schemes have been implemented. Placement cell has been strengthened.
- 3. More seminars and workshops are organized on recent technologies.

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

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Faculty Feedback on Curriculum and Syllabus

Analysis and Action Taken Report

Feedback on various aspects of curriculum is sought from 174 faculty members of Velalar College of Engineering and Technology.

This information provided by faculty will be used as an important feedback for improvement of the curriculum. This questionnaire is intended to collect information regarding various aspects of the curriculum.

As teachers play a pivotal role in designing and implementing the curriculum, the inputs received from their feedback was taken into consideration for further necessary action wherever applicable,

To consider for major and minor revision / modification in curriculum to make it locally and globally relevant and to promote employability.

The aspects such as provision of adequate time and resources for Add on courses, coverage of both theoretical and practical components in the syllabus, the coherence of the syllabus with programme Outcomes, involvement of the field experts while focus on necessary technical/teaching skills, ensuring components that inculcate ethical values, enlisting reference books, focus on flexible curriculum based on current trends, content beyond syllabus and updated elective courses etc.

- Majority of the teachers accepted that syllabus is framed with major focus on necessary technical skills required for Special Education and Extracurricular activities.
- 89.77% of faculty members agreed that the curriculum and syllabus are need based.
- 89.54% of teachers agreed that they have the freedom to adopt new techniques/ education tools/ strategies in teaching.
- 89.43% of teachers strongly agreed that the they have the freedom to propose, modify, suggest and incorporate new topics in the syllabus through proper forum.
- 89.08% of the teachers strongly agreed that the Sufficient number of relevant reading materials and digital resources are available in the Library.
- 88.97 % of them strongly agreed that the course outcomes are well defined and clear.
- Majority of teachers agreed appropriateness of academic tasks in the course plan-87.35%, Depth and breadth of course content of the syllabus-85.75%, Relevancy of syllabus for competitive exams-84.48%, The course has good balance between theory and application-87.47%, The Institute has given opportunities for research activity-87.13%.

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Suggestions from Faculty members:

- 1. It was suggested that there would be more resources provided in the library and an improvement made in the facility provided by the sports department.
- 2. Faculty members also felt that the placements and internship opportunities needed improvement.
- 3. Syllabus should include practical based approach.
- 4. Research quality may be enhanced by collaborative research with other institutions and industries.

Action Taken

- 1. The analysis of the teachers' feedback reflects the adequacy and availability of teaching-learning facilities.
- 2. The feedback from the teachers revealed the validity and adequacy of the syllabus and also, it is quite helpful in reframing the course content according to the societal needs.
- 3. Various suggestions related to the modifications in the curricular content are noted for further necessary action.
- 4. The practical based approach is implemented for some of the courses by our faculty members through special workshop and guest Lecture.
- 5. Faculty members are motivated for attending the FDP's, NPTEL courses, workshops and also for publishing research paper in reputed Journal's.

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

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Employer Feedback on Curriculum and Syllabus

Analysis and Action Taken Report

Employer's feedback is obtained from various recruiting industries with the help of structured questionnaire. Their feedback is sought on the following areas:

Employer's feedback on the technical skills of the students, ability of the students to volunteer themselves to get into initiatives taken up by the Industry, adequacy of necessary communication skills to meet the job requirements, ability to learn industrial practices fast and mould themselves into the stream. It was found from eir feedback that,

- 68% of Employers conveyed that the technical knowledge of the students is good.
- 76% of employers said that the curriculum and syllabus provides sufficient knowledge in the area of study.
- 79% of the employers agreed that the students are able to work as team.
- 77% of employers commented that the students are able to communicate effectively.
- 72% of the employers conveyed that the students have the required managerial skills and leadership qualities.
- 73% of the employers said the syllabus helped the students to volunteer themselves to get into initiatives taken up by the Industry.
- 66% of the employers suggested that the students shall align themselves for industries demands.
- 74% of the employers agreed that the students have the ability to learn industrial practices fast and mould themselves into the stream.
- 69% of the employers recommended that the curriculum and non-curricular initiatives shall be taken up by VCET to attain the required competency level.

Suggestions from the Employer's:

- 1. Curriculum enrichment through the Content beyond Syllabus and Add-on Courses shall be incorporated.
- 2. Internship with corporate can be encouraged to acquire fair knowledge on company processes and policies.
- 3. Develop curriculum and syllabus to enhance practical skills of the students to bridge the gap between curriculum and industries.
- 4. Encourage students to undergo In-plant trainings in more number of core industries to have a better knowledge in their field. AUTONO

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Action Taken:

- 1. Developed a curriculum wherein more technical trainings and add-on programmes on recent technologies are introduced in the courses.
- 2. The practical based approach is implemented through special workshop and guest Lecture.
- 3. Lectures beyond the syllabus to cover recent trends in the Industry have been executed.
- 4. Decided to conduct extra experiments for the courses during laboratory hours and plan more industry visits.
- 5. Training programmes for Personality Development were arranged to improve the communication skills of the students.

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
